GOD HAS, INDEED, BEEN WITH US

FROM THE VIRTUAL DESK AT THE ALL DISCIPLES SING

Sitting in the sanctuary at the All Disciples Sing on Sunday afternoon was a spiritually evocative and moving time for me for so many reasons.

One year ago October 18 First Christian Dawson Springs said goodbye to their beloved pastor, Rev. Mike Moschenrose, after years living with cancer. With no pastor and no music director, they faced an uncertain future in their recovering town. He had hoped for them to have a strong children's and music ministries, even as they had no pianist to play their hymns and were singing along to videos. And yet, a year later, three ministry staff members from the church Mike loved so much were standing before us at the All Disciples Sing at First Christian Owensboro praising God in beautiful three-part harmony! In a year, God has taken their church from a wilderness time to a time of great joy and celebration that fills their sanctuary with music. Wow! Isn't God awesome?

After singing an uplifting duet of praise with Beth Pittman, First Christian Mayfield's music director, Stephen Clark, shared the song "Bless this House"--a piece that he had sung at Mayfield's groundbreaking for their new building as they continue their own recovery from the 2021 tornado. Reminding us all that First Christian Owensboro had also gone through their own rebuilding after the destruction of their building (theirs due to fire in 2013), as he prepared to sing a song of blessing for his future church home, Stephen said, "It's just a great feeling to feel like you have a church home again." Thanks be to God for hope and resurrection!

Later, as we took communion, the lst/3rd Quartet sang "God Thou Art Love." These four began singing when, after the 2013 fire, First Christian Owensboro was borrowing space from Third Baptist Church. Years later, the two men from First Christian and two men from Third Baptist share their talents with both churches--often traveling to both worship services on the same Sunday morning! The four remain a symbol, not only of their past journey together, but of an ecumenical spirit of love as Third Baptist's remarkable hospitality continues to bear fruit.

The whole worship was filled with songs of thanksgiving by talented musicians, and it was as if God was reminding me again and again of the depths and heights that God will travel with usthrough fire and storm and the deepest of griefshepherding us and offering hope, peace, and love for the journey. Immanuel! God with us!

APPLY TO BE A DPF PEACE INTERN

Disciples Peace Fellowship is overjoyed to announce that we are now accepting applications for the 2025 DPF Peace Intern Program! Visit disciplespeace.org/apply to learn more about the program and to start your application! Applications are due by January 31, 2025.

Each year DPF selects three young adults (21-years-old or older) to serve as Peace Interns. This is a 12-week, paid, summer internship (\$3,000 stipend) that will allow you to serve as an advocate for peace and justice in many different ways. The 2025 DPF Peace Internship will be a hybrid model again this summer. That means that Peace Interns will serve at inperson Disciples of Christ Church Camps AND they will have remote work weeks where they work on specific projects with Disciples Justice Ministries groups (like



work weeks where they work on specific projects with Disciples Justice Ministries groups (like AllianceQ, Reconciliation Ministries, Green Chalice, Be The Neighbor, and more) or interfaith/ecumenical peace partners. The 2025 Peace Intern summer experience will begin in late May, include a working trip to General Assembly in Memphis, and end in early August.

YOUTH LEADERSHIP SYMPOSIUM 2025

Youth Leadership Symposium (YLS) is a new ministry preparing high school youth to lead in their local congregations. Every congregation can have one youth attend for free each year. Adult participants are also welcome. YLS brings youth together via Zoom or local "pods" to learn about building partnerships, facing change, finding mentors, navigating congregational polity, and taking ideas and making them reality. YLS 2025 will begin in February and run through June. Three Saturday "symposiums" are required along with reading, mentor meetings, and event planning between gatherings. To complete YLS, each youth designs and leads a project in their local congregation. Those projects are shared on the YLS website so other youth and congregations can draw inspiration.
